# Garden Visiting Group

We wandered through historic Gertrude Jekyll water gardens and formal Italian gardens, as well as marvelling at the location and its listed greenhouses.







Later in the month our second visit was to Wisley for the Alpine Society show.

In October, shortly after our Epsom and Ewell AGM, the Third Age Trust will be holding their own AGM. This year the current chair, Liz Thackray, finishes her term in office and three candidates have stood for election.

During June, as chair, I have attended the hustings where all three candidates have set out what they feel they can offer the movement and they have answered numerous questions put by members.

The first hustings were available for all members to attend and was followed later on the same day by hustings held by the Chairs forum of which I am a member.

The Chairs forum was set up over the past year in response to requests from chairs of u3a's across the UK for a body that would allow free and open discussion between chairs of their vision for the future, this does at times differ from the vision of the Trust unfortunately. The chairs forum meets monthly on Zoom and discusses various topics that they feel are of interest. They also have a dedicated private Facebook group where chairs can ask questions and discuss issues.

Recently that has included discussions and presentations about the National Council, Fit for the Future, how we market the u3a as a movement and most recently how to use Facebook pages to promote the movement.

Each u3a has the opportunity to vote for the candidate that they would like to succeed Liz Thackray and your committee have all been provided with the statements of the candidates, video statements from two of the candidates and a link to the chair's forum hustings.

If any member is interested you can find links to all the relevant information on our website on the Fit for the Future page.

Our Epsom and Ewell executive committee will discuss this election at our next committee meeting on July 4<sup>th</sup> and decide which candidate to vote for. Voting closes on July 15<sup>th</sup> and the new Trust chair will take office in October.

None of this will directly affect us as each u3a is an independent part of the overall movement but it is important that members are kept up to date with developments at Trust level.








# Ten Pin Bowling

This is a free service that they offer to locally based charities.




# Hever in Bloom
